Robodebt responsible for \$1.5bn unlawful debts in 'very sorry chapter', court hears


Hundreds of welfare recipients argue a settlement with the government does not reflect the 'stress and anxiety' caused by robodebt










DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND CENTRELINK DEBTS





Key findings

- Member of a Couple determinations can serve to tie women's access to social security payments to their abuser
- Victims/Survivors are unfairly incurring social security debts, including as a direct result of the actions of abusers
- Social security compliance and fraud mechanisms are being misused by abusers as tools of violence
- Victims/Survivors struggle to access appropriate assistance and support




How do women experiencing domestic violence end up with Centrelink debts?

Decisions about who is a Member of a Couple



Should she be considered a member of a couple for Centrelink purposes?





Member of a Couple criteria

s.4(3)

- the financial aspects of the relationship
- the nature of the household
- the social aspects of the relationship
- the presence or absence of a sexual relationship
- the nature of the commitment



Financial abuse seen as evidence of being a member of a couple

3 examples of 'evidence' relied on by Centrelink decision makers to support a finding that a person was/is a member of a couple:

- Perpetrator accessing the client's bank account
- Perpetrator coming into Centrelink with a client
- Birth of a child




Financial aspects of the relationship should be considered critical





Liability for debts caused by abusers can rest with victims



Limited fix Discretion to treat as not a Member of a Couple

Her abusive husband intentionally lied about his income and assets but ... she's left with the Centrelink debt



Limitation on debt waiver discretion

- knowingly
- another person
- special circumstances
